The roads have not been cleaned correctly, and this is now being monitored and he is awaiting further updates. Bus Services are now restarting again after previously stopping due to the pandemic. There seems to have been no issues with any key workers being able to travel to work due to the limited bus service. Unison – have advised they would consider a grant request regarding the community work being carried out with meals for vulnerable people in the community. Cllr Wilson is to forward contact details to CW. PPE – still trying to find suppliers of PPE. The parish should keep an eye on unemployment in the community and the vulnerable people following the pandemic. 		 The Village Inn has finally been demolished. After nearly 7 years of working with the council to try and have something done with the building, it was a torrential storm that forced progression. The site will be grassed over with a bird mouth fence around it. Based on the number of complaints I have received from residents over the years about patients parking outside Sacriston Medical Centre, Wesley Close and the Methodist Church car park I have asked the council to consider funding some parking on the site, however due to the cost it is unlikely this will be agreed. Shop Front Improvement Scheme – The update from the team is that one completed grant application has been received from Bespoke. They continue to work with other businesses to complete applications, however the lockdown and business closures has caused some delays. The gap site between E-clips and Pizza Top has been proposed as a new car park to accommodate the customers to new businesses at the top end of the front street. Thanks to the popularity of Bespoke and Hunt butchers the top end of the street has become more popular, and if the 24 hour gym ever opens, it should attract a high number of users from outside the area who will probably travel by car. Planning for the Children's home was approved, and the purchase of the property has now been completed. Ripley Court – the flats are becoming an increasing concern to local residents who are witnessing ASB in the vicinity. The police and neighbourhood protection team are currently dealing with the complaints There have been several deliberate fires around the Fulforth Loop and woods near the pit estate. The most recent being last night where the fire service attended a fire at the Fulforth Dene. There have also been complaints of ASB behind the Fulforth Centre, the police have been patrolling the area. There have been several complaints received about Friends barbers who have allegedly continued to trade throughout the lock down. DCC Licencing
